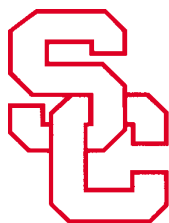

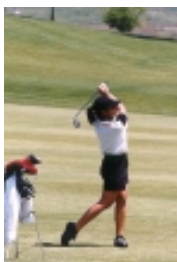

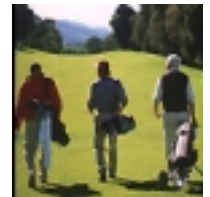
#### President's Day Outing

Site of the 1968 Los Angeles Open & rated in the top 25 public golf courses in Southern California, these two Billy Bell designed courses are just 200 yards north of the Rose Bowl. Both offer unique challenges with hazards and bunkers. Also, given a two-star rating by Golf Digest. Includes cart, green fees, range balls and awards.

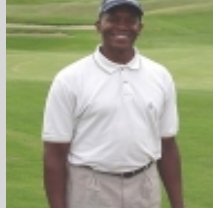

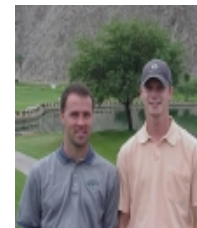
