Humans and Automation: Studies on the Creation of Regulations in Nascent Drone Industry

My dissertation aims to shed light on how entrepreneurs influence the creation of regulations when automation has started to be integrated into human society. The fast development of Artificial Intelligence, Cryptocurrency, Unmanned Vehicles has outpaced traditional regulations. To understand how regulations are created to catch up with new technologies, current studies have not fully explored the political activities of heterogeneous entrepreneurs. My dissertation examined three types of entrepreneurs: 1) cross-niches entrepreneurs influence state regulations 2) entrepreneurial clusters influence state regulation innovations 3) entrepreneurs' online comments influence federal regulations. My analyses are based on 9,000 news reports and legal documents from 2013 to 2018 provided by 10,000 commercial drone service firms and related regulators. I found that 1) cross-niches entrepreneurs collaborate with regulators to encourage new entrants' exploration and coordination with market incumbents. 2) states with more entrepreneurial clusters are more likely to have innovative regulatory forms. 3) noisy online public comments increase information filter bars of federal regulators, which in turn motivate them to adopt comments from entrepreneurs who have less noisy comments.
